This time trial was different than any before in the history of AROSC. So naturally we named it the AROSC Course. By the time several people made the wrong turn more than once I am sure they thought they were on a rally instead of at a time trial. This Time Trial was meant to separate the rally enthusiast from those who really wanted to go racing. Well, the mystery story unfolds like this:

Turn one through six were the same as always. Then you were supposed to head toward turn eight. But before you got there you would make a very sharp second gear right hand turn and head back toward turn seven. When you reached turn seven you then put it in second gear again and made another sharp left hand turn and then an immediate right and head on to the back straightaway. The real mystery was that we were running the part of the Can-Am course between seven and eight in a backwards direction. Flagging at the new turn stations was very much in demand all day long as everyone wanted to see the different approaches to the new turns. There was a lot of heavy braking, tire squeeling, cars off the course, and dirt flying as the first tew laps were being negotiated.

As the day progressed we saw some excellent driving and some real close times were turned in during the timed runs, especially in class F and A. We had 25 entries and only two were unable to make their timed runs. These were Paul Smith who had a clogged fuel pump, and Charles Lee who was suffering from low oil pressure. We also had five novice drivers who passed their driving tests and were awarded their licenses at the end of the day. These licensed drivers are: J. Lardner, G. Zettle, W. Gobble, P. Carrett and J. Harris. Congratulation to each of you from AROSC, and we hope you will continue to participate in the

time trial program. Due to the fact that this was a new course, each of the class winners has set a new course record. Bob Barlow's time of 1:53.87 was the top time of the day. Keep up the fast driving Bob!

This was a great time trial for all who participated, and I wish to thank JIM GRAY IMPORTS in Long Beach for their continued and generous support of our time trial program and for sponsorship of this third time trial. We have two more time trials left for 1976 and the next one will be Saturday, August 14th at Riverside. This time we will be running the short course which all of you are familiar with, so there will be no guessing or rally excursions. See you at Riverside on August 14th.



Many of you are preparing those beautiful Alfas. Keep going and get your cars ready for September 12th.

Concours del Alfa Romeo now has a sronsor. Tony Baumgartner of Parkinson V.W. & Alfa in Placentia has given his full sponsorship. They are providing full support for the trophies.

Stations will be provided for every car and also added guards are being provided. 


