It is a refreshing and wonderful thing when AROSC members suggest and stage a new event, and Naomi and Peter Pavia did this for us in late June.

Pavia Vineyards is their passion project, and they shared it with us in the lush, relaxing gardens of their Thousand Oaks home, at the foot of a suburban hillside covered in, what else? Vines!

Our group numbered nearly 20, mostly the Valley contingent, and included David and Sylvia of Central California chapter, who came down from Carpinteria. We contributed hors d'oeuvres and dessert bites and snooped into their garage, where their very clean GTV, vintage Moto Guzzi and heirloom 1950s Cadillac reside.

Boutique winegrowing is a niche activity that the Pavias are ready to share with like-minded enthusiasts in Southern and Central California. The planting, tending, harvesting, pressing, bottling becomes a big hobby quickly, and they can guide the amateur as they grow into a skilled vintner. They trend toward organic and natural farming techniques, encouraging their customers to do so, and no added sulfites when bottling.

The vintages include a range of 6 - 8 reds. Syrah, Pinot Noir lead the list for what grows most happily in the Conejo Valley





area. Their first vintage was a 2011 Syrah, and their latest were bottled just before our visit and are aging now. They opened a 2018 Super Tuscan for us that was delicious.

It was a perfect summer celebration and a congenial gathering of good friends, old and new. *Mille Grazie* to you, Peter and Naomi.



This was a car show summer. August was amazing for our members, who distinguished themselves and their Alfas on the roads and at *concorsi* all over California – from Los Angeles to Carmel and Seaside to San Marino.

Starting August 3rd in Los Angeles, more than 45 Alfa Romeos supported the second iteration of Mike Baum, Bronson Page and Dorian Valenzuela's **Macchinissima**, *Italian Motoring Celebrated*, staged in the Los Angeles River Center and Gardens. A few of us directed entries to their places in the display areas, some of our cars were stars in the courtyard, others of us brought friends and family for a day in L.A.

There were cappuccino and Aperol spritzes; Nancy Silverton-designed pizzas (one na ned "Zagato" and

at the Best of France & Italy and

"This still feels very surreal," Scott said. "We had no expectation of receiving an award, although I saw Art Center students examining the car, hanging out, not leaving. Of all the special awards at the show, this is one would I'm most happy to have." The car has a great history, being one of 25 right-hand-drive SSes built; being the 1965 Earl's Court show car and 1965





press car; being subsequently owned and raced by renowned British saloon car champion and rally organizer Nick Brittan. And a feature at The Quail this August was a special display honoring World Rally champs – a nice tie-in for this SS. Scott did the prep himself, spending 12+hours polishing. "There is A LOT of chrome on this car!" he declared. Next, its presence is requested on campus at Art Center an after party/study session, but Scott is happy: "Now I can drive it, which is why I bought it!"







After Monterey came the **San Marino Motor Classic**, and AROSC was there as well. Ken Roath's TZ (above left, next to Adil Farooqui's Spider) was the Italian Sports Cars Alfa Romeo 1946-1975 and Art Center Award winner; Adil's SS (center, next to Val Dietrich's 2000 Touring) was third in the class; and Tony Cortes brought a very pretty 1900 Touring (right, with Dan Ritter). "It was a fun show and Tony's car was well received. I knew Al was looking down from Heaven and smiling," Dan said. AROSC Treasurer Jay Mackro was there and reported, "Our Alfa guys Shelly Zide and Arno Leskinen (AROC national concorso chair), were Alfa judges. Yours truly was assigned to judge Mercedes 300 sedans, which was educational, but didn't have much to do with Alfas." Nonetheless, it was great to have an Alfa class at the event and to have our members present to represent the marque and our chapter. *Forza!* 

### Do you know ...

# How to Register Your Guests for Events in ClubExpress?!?

Your Alfa Club Chapter uses electronic channels for social and business communications. Event pre-registrations and payments are handled by ClubExpress, the club's online communication service. You will need your username and password to sign-in before attempting to follow these instructions. Please verify your login and update it if necessary.

The website has standard features for resetting your username and password. If you encounter difficulties, please contact AROC's administrative team at 971-254-6660. Nikki or Susan should be able to help you.

When our chapter event organizers plan an activity requiring an RSVP or payment, they set up a ClubExpress calendar listing to facilitate the registration. Event eblasts and promotions in *Alfacionada* provide a direct event link at <a href="https://aroc-usa.clubexpress.com">https://aroc-usa.clubexpress.com</a>.

Here's the procedure, plus what to do go register your guest(s):

- 1. Go to the national website, aroc-usa.org, and click on the AROC@ClubExpress button under the club logo.
- 2. Click on Member Login and provide your Username and Password
- 3. Click on AROC Calendar.
- 4. Scroll down to the date of the event (A visual example is available on request).
- 5. Click on View Event Details and read the event details; there may be more than one part of the event to register for.
- 6. Click on Register Now.
- 7. Scroll down to "Who is registering for this event?" Click on "Me+", and choose the number of your guests. Then click the bottom "Next" button.
- 8. Click "Next" again.
- 9. Fill in your guest information, and then click "Next".
- 10. Click Complete Registration to pay.

Note: If you need to return to a previous page, use the RED "BACK" BUTTON at the bottom of the page. Do NOT use the gray return arrow at the top left corner of your browser – it will corrupt your registration and disallow payment and/or registration for you and your guests.

To exit the event listing, click on "events" in the navigation buttons at the top left of the page you are in. You will be sent back to the top of the calendar listing to start over.
