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Giving Our Classics a Break

SB 712 could roll back smog checks to cars built through 1990

California State Sen. Shannon Grove and former "The Tonight Show" host and classic car enthusiast Jay Leno joined forces this past winter in an effort to keep more classic cars on the road in the golden state.

"Leno's Law," or Senate Bill 712, proposes to remove biennial smog requirements from classic cars 35 model years or older - contingent on them being insured as a collector vehicle.

"California's smog-check laws for classic cars need to be updated," Leno said.

Currently only vehicles built through 1975 are exempt from smog checks. That means any

vehicle manufactured from 1976 through today is subject to being smogged. But, properly functioning dated smog equipment appropriate to test those older vehicles is quickly disappearing. In recent years owners of vehicles built as recently as 2000 report difficulty finding shops willing and able to keep their cars on the road.

The "Smog Bill" bill is also backed by the Specialty Equipment Market Association (SEMA), which represents 1,066 small automotive aftermarket businesses in California, and is expected to move through the legislative process throughout the coming months.



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This event will be held on the picturesque lawns of Huntington Beach Central Park in Huntington Beach. Central Park is adjacent to the Huntington Beach Public Library and Cultural Resource Center on Talbert Avenue between Goldenwest and Gothard Streets.

If you plan to exhibit your car, you must register by noon on Friday, May 30th. Early registration is recommended, as the event could fill up. Registration costs \$60/car and can be completed on line at

<https://www.hbconcours.org/register-vehicle/> or by mailing in the paper form available at <https://www.hbconcours.org/obscuredir/wp-content/themes/twentyten/pdf/Sunday%20Entry%20Form.pdf>.

Two people (driver + passenger) can ride into the event with each registered car. You can request that your Alfa not be judged, but you'll still need to register through the Concours website to park it on the field. Even if you don't register an Alfa, you can still join the fun; spectator entry is \$15 per person and parking is available at the Sports Complex.

The Huntington Beach Concours organizers have defined their Alfa Romeo classes in a way that doesn't fit our club's usual classes,

but we can make it work with your help. So please select a class as defined below when you register your car:

06A Open: All open Alfas through 2014

06B Closed: All closed Alfas through 2014

06C Sedan: All Alfas 2015 and newer

AROSC members with pre-2015 cars who wish to compete in AROSC's Classic Street class (formerly called "Daily Driver") should enter the appropriate Huntington Beach class (06A or 06B) and select "Street or Race" sub class on the entry form. Similarly, owners of 2015 and later Alfas who wish to compete in AROSC's Modern Special class should select 06C and check "Street or Race" on the form. The AROSC section of the Huntington Beach Concours has historically been an integral part of this very large, friendly event and with your help, will continue that tradition in 2025. So, polish up your Alfa, bring a picnic lunch, chairs, comfortable shoes and sunscreen, and we'll see you there!

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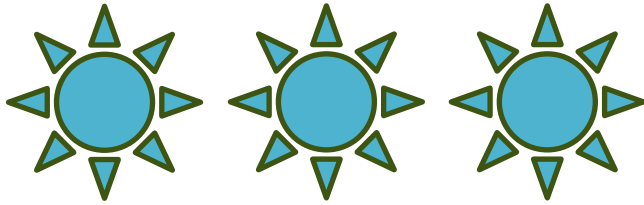
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July 26th – Save the Date AROSC Summer Party!

Registration will be through ClubExpress and will open in mid-June, so watch for an eblast announcement around that




time. Participation will be limited, so you will have to sign up early.

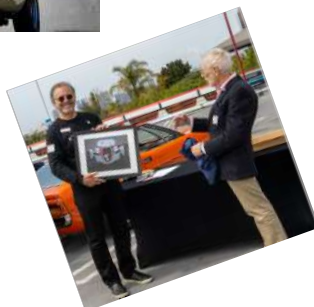
Irie, Oggi, Domani Photo Contest Winners

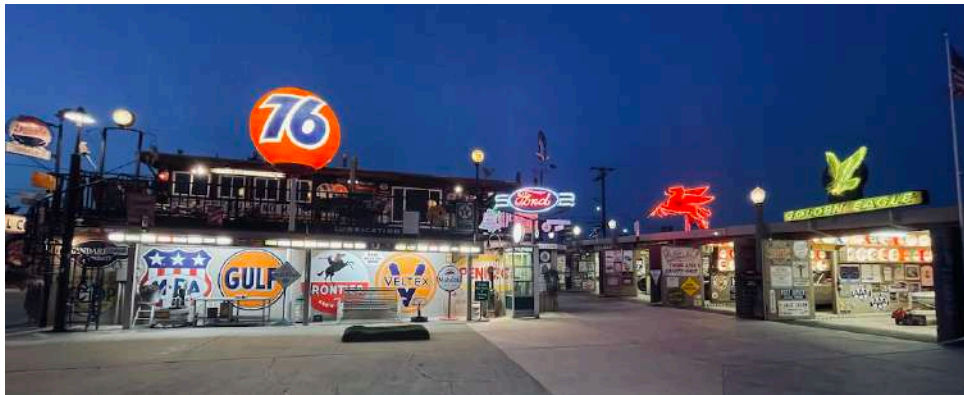
prepared a genuine Santa Maria barbecue with salad and beans from recipes created by family members. One evening was not enough to see it all!

It is a lovely smokey gray Alfa alloy. It came mounted on a new/never used Pirelli tire. I kept that for my new spare wheel that matches the four that came with my car. But until I found that, this has ridden in the trunk of my previous and my current Giulias. Never had to put it on the car ... which is the whole point. This will work as a spare for 17-, 18-, and 19-inch Alfa wheels since the circumferences and diameters are when wearing the correct size tires, are within fractions of an inch of each other. \$225.
