Moving Experiences

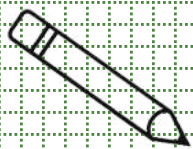

Pompeii a Roma - The Epilog

How we discovered the gracious lifestyles of our contemporary Angelenos and the ancients of Herculaneum in one morning drive

About 15 Alfas (including two fake ones) greeted the morning sun with espresso and sweet rolls. There was time and space to look at the cars, finish the paperwork, and then line up for the departure. The Via Veneto, with its enormous electronic billboards quickly melted into the Boulevard of the Emperors (Sunset Blvd.) Traveling at 30 miles an hour, it was amazing how much there was to see – lush trees, and behind them, mansions along the 11-mile journey through the different neighborhoods dotting the road.

A strange narrow little street line with fantastic tree sculptures took us through one of the best-disguised and wealthiest enclaves on the trip. Then we twisted out way to the bluffs of Santa Monica – towering over the ocean and beaches. Pathways on the bluffs and down along the ocean were filled with

runners and walkers and bike riders and people watchers.

Finally, we arrived 2000 years back in time, in the Roman city of Pompeii, recreated in part by the Getty Villa. We were shown to our special parking area put aside for the club. Then we met our docents and broke into two separate tour groups. Each tour covered the same information, but was also very different, so different many wished they could have done both. And we realized that we had just scratched the surface of this phenomenal recreation of life in 79 AD. Ironically just four days

after our visit was the 1,946th anniversary of the Vesuvius eruption and the burial of the city of Pompeii.

Following the docent-led tours, some of us enjoyed picnicking, while others sampled the Villa's café. Then some stayed on and self-toured the many exhibits, while others began their rides home. It was an easy-going, relaxed Alfa Sunday ... and the new year is already filling up with AROSC events. Look for more opportunities to tour our fair city in this 21st century.
